Parent Worship Questions Worship ideas for Fundamental 23 - Family

For Parents (From God loves me 28 Ways for kids)

- God creates marriage between a man and a woman to last forever (Eccl 9:9; 1 Cor 7:39). They promise to love each other in happy times and in sad times.
- Marriage is sacred because God has made it holy. Divorce is not God's plan because we are affected by the pain when our parents break up (Matt 19:3-9).
- Fathers and mothers are to love, respect, and honour each other as Christ loves His Church. (Eph 5:21-33; Col 3:18-19)
- Parents are to bring up their children to love and obey God. (Deut 6:7-9)

Start with the end in mind

- The children are to learn that when we work together as a team our family achieves more and is able to demonstrate to others in our community what God's love is really like.
- Parents need to set and model values of love, respect and honour for every member in the family.

But each one of you must love his wife as he loves himself. And a wife must respect her husband.

- Ephesians 5:33 (ICB)

Using the Tuis Video - Worship Objectives

- As parents we need to patiently model how God gives us second chances even when we think that we know better. (Note how in the video, Marica & Salome fixed the billy cart when Sefa and Jonathan's attempt at building it failed, even though Sefa and Jonathan thought they knew better than them. Marica and Salome gave Sefa and Jonathan a second chance).
- Our children need to learn about how facing life's challenges together as a family will help them overcome obstacles in life. (The video illustrates this when we see Marica and Salome join forces to help reconstruct a better model of the Lizmango billy cart for Sefa and Jonathan enabling them to win the race.)



For parents with their kids, choose one or two from each of the following 4 types of questions to generate discussion:

1. CAN YOU REMEMBER?



What are 2 of the other 3 "Tui traditions" that Marica and Lome joke about during the opening scene of the video? (jellyfish juggling, goat whispering, bringing the gnome home.)





What does Kosta sneak into the garage to do while Sefa and Jonathan are busy looking at the blueprint of their billy cart?
(He presses the button on the tape measure to shorten it, which meant that the Tui's billy cart measurements would be all wrong.)

The name of the Kappa's Team? (Team Aubergine)

The name of the Tui's billy cart? (Lizmango)



Now say a short prayer thanking God for providing us with families to care for us and help us even when we may push them away when they offer to help us. If your family is going through challenging times, ask God to pour His love into everyone's hearts so that relationships may be healed.

2. CAN YOU TELL ME?

What the 'Bringing the gnome home' tradition is all about?




What was one similarity and one difference between Tui and the Kappa's families in the ways that they faced challenging situations?



(A) (It's a game played between two neighbours, Peter and Sefa, who bought the gnome together. When one has the gnome at their place, the other one will try to get it back to their home without the other one catching them.)

(B) (Similarity - They both enjoyed winning games together as families. For example the way they both had their families working together to try to 'bring home the gnome.'

Difference - The Tuis focussed as a family on trying to repair and improve their billy cart, without trying to spoil the efforts of the opposing team, while the Kappa's wanted to win as a family, so were willing to find dishonest ways to sabotage the Tui's billy cart.)




(A) (Yes) What are the qualities and what in the video suggests this? (1. Forgiveness and grace in Marica and Salome - this helped them to fix the billy cart up secretly when Sefa and Jonathan had refused their suggestions and offer to help with building their billy cart. 2. A willingness and humility to listen to others, which enabled Sefa and Jonathan to admit that they needed to listen to Marica and Salome about improvements they'd made to the billy cart. They also listened to Marica's last instruction which made them win.)

(B) (No) Give reasons for your answer using evidence from the video. (By doing this, Peter was teaching his sons to use dishonest ways to make sure their competitors lost. This was very un-Christ like behaviour. Their bad sportsmanship as a family did not pay off. Marica and Salome's supportive actions of their family (Christ-like behaviour) however, paid off resulting in Peter's family's dishonest ways being stopped.

(C)

(Yes) Explain your answer. (While it's good to have some father - son or mother-daughter bonding time every now and then, a family activity where the whole family contributes can be what's needed to strengthen the whole family. This was evident in the clip when the Tui family won the billy cart race because Marica and Salome surprised Sefa and Jonathan with an updated version of the "Lizmango" to race after the other version built by Sefa and Jonathan fell apart.)

4. WHO SAID THIS & WHY?



- (A) (Sefa) Why? (He was saying this to Jonathan to convince him that entering the billy cart race would be a good 'father/son' project to do together.)
- (B) (Salome) Why? (Because she was trying to let her dad know that refusing help from Marica and her, was not a good idea. Sefa being too proud to accept help from the ladies in his life was a major mistake.)
- (C) (Sefa the father) Why? (Because he realised that with the whole family involved in the billy cart project, they were able to win the race. Their stubbornness in not accepting any help from Marica and Salome almost cost the Tui boys the race.)

Christian courtesy is the golden clasp which unites the members of the family in bonds of love, becoming closer and stronger every day. (The Adventist Home, p. 423)

The husband and father is the head of the household. The wife looks to him for love and sympathy, and for aid in the training of the children; and this is right. The children are his as well as hers, and he is equally interested in their welfare. (The Ministry of Healing, p. 390)

The home should be to the children the most attractive place in the world, and the mother's presence should be its greatest attraction. (The Ministry of Healing p. 388)

Home should be a place where cheerfulness, courtesy, and love abide; and where these graces dwell, there will abide happiness and peace. Troubles may invade, but these are the lot of humanity. Let patience, gratitude, and love keep sunshine in the heart, though the day may be ever so cloudy. In such homes angels of God abide. (The Ministry of Healing p. 393)

Let the husband and wife study each other's happiness, never failing in the small courtesies and little kindly acts that cheer and brighten the life. Perfect confidence should exist between husband and wife. Together they should consider their responsibilities. (The Ministry of Healing, p. 393)

God would have our family's symbols of the family in heaven. Let parents and children bear this in mind every day, relating themselves to one another as members of the family of God. Then their lives will be of such a character as to give to the world an object lesson of what families who love God and keep His commandments may be. Christ will be glorified; His peace and grace and love will pervade the family circle like a precious perfume. (The Adventist Home, p. 17)

The home that is beautified by love, sympathy, and tenderness is a place that angels love to visit, and where God is glorified. The influence of a carefully guarded Christian home in the years of childhood and youth is the surest safeguard against the corruptions of the world. In the atmosphere of such a home the children will learn to love both their earthly parents and their heavenly Father (The Adventist Home, p. 19)

The family relationship should be sanctifying in its influence. Christian homes, established and conducted in accordance with God's plan, are a wonderful help in forming Christian character.... Parents and children should unite in offering loving service to Him who alone can keep human love pure and noble. (The Adventist Home, p. 19)

The home in which the members are polite, courteous Christians exerts a farreaching influence for good. Other families will mark the results attained by such a home, and will follow the example set, in their turn guarding the home against Satanic influences. The angels of God will often visit the home in which the will of God bears sway. Under the power of divine grace such a home becomes a place of refreshing to worn, weary pilgrims. (The Adventist Home, p. 31)



Substitute the right letters above each number in the puzzle below to discover one of the things Jesus said about marriage relationships.


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When you've discovered what Jesus said, say a simple prayer to God asking Him to help your family to stay united, even if your parents have decided to separate or divorce. If your parents are together but spending a lot of time arguing or fighting, pray for God's love and peace to settle on their hearts so that there will be healing and forgiveness in their relationship.

4. MAZE

Start from the top of the maze to find the right path to reach the centre.



This maze is like the relationships within our families. Sometimes we seem to be going well but then end up in a 'dead end.' But God gives us second chances and wants us to do the same to each other in our families.



Now ask God in prayer to help you give your siblings and parents second chances when let you down or don't meet your expectations. Also ask God to help you to also be responsible in your roles as part of your family.

5. LETTER TILES

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Now ask Jesus Christ in prayer to protect your parent's marriage from evil forces that try to separate them. If your parents have separated or divorced, ask for God to heal them both from the hurt and pain which this would have caused. Pray for God to bless them with healthy communications between themselves, you and your family members.

FAMILY CHALLENGES

(Choose 1 or 2 you might like to do as a family this week)

- ➤ Reflect on and review some 'family traditions' that you have continued over the years which have kept you together. Decide if you need new ones or if you need to revive some that are no longer being done.
- Apart from daily practise of having family worship times here is a list of Family Traditions you might like to consider:
- i) Gratitude Journal on a Friday night as part of a special family meal to welcome in Sabbath, you can have a Journal called the "Gratitude Journal" where you record the response from each family member to the questions: What are you grateful for from this past week and what do you most look forward to doing tomorrow (Sabbath)?

For those families with younger children or more visual learners, instead of writing down their answers, family members can look through old magazines, cut out pictures that describe their answers and then glue them in the gratitude journal.

ii) Praise God day - pick one day a week to fast and pray as a family. It could be that you choose to have non-processed foods or to stop going on social media for one full day so you can spend more time connecting with God more regularly during that particular day.

To help your family to focus on praying, every hour use prayer texts that can be texted to each other on social media, or given a little 'post it' notes in their school exercise books on that day. On this special day, each hour each person reads the text assigned for that hour and then prays a quick prayer about that text, praising God for what this text teaches them about Him and asking Him to grow this character trait in their lives.

You, as parents, can generate these Bible texts lists based on a different quality of God by doing a search for keywords (e.g. "God love") in www.biblegateway.com or other such sites. You can also type "bible texts about God's love" in a google or other such engines. For those that don't have easy access to the internet, you can use a Bible Concordance, or just go through the book of Psalms chapter by chapter to find texts that God leads you to generate these lists.

Teenage children can also be assigned the honour to prayerfully generate these texts for the family to use each week

iii) Connect with neighbours day -

Choose a day in the week where you as a family can connect with your neighbours in meaningful ways. Maybe there's a new neighbour that has just moved into the neighbourhood, or an elderly widow, or elderly couple or sick neighbours, or people with disabilities, or single mothers or a mother with a new born baby.

Pray as a family for 2-3 days before the chosen day, and ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to your family which family to visit, what their key need is and how best to meet that need. Do as the Holy Spirit directs/reveals and visit that family together.

iv) Visit or adopt a Grandparent -

Decide as a family to visit your children's grandparents on a particular day each week or month, if they are still alive and/ or live near you. If not, adopt at least 2 grandparents in the local community or rest home. Pray for God to reveal their need/s and ask Him how you should meet those needs. Carry out the Holy Spirit's instructions that He reveals during your prayers.

v) Adopt a local service provider month

Choose a local service provider (e.g. police station, hospital, fire station, doctors, health clinic, schools etc) to adopt each month of the year.

Pray for God to reveal what they really need and how to meet that need. Follow what the Holy Spirit reveals. Some examples of what your family could do for a school include: offering to read with children that struggle, helping the teacher prepare resources (cut out shapes etc), clean up the classroom, pick up trash around the school and emptying rubbish bins for the school caretaker, do a prayer walk around the school buildings (even if it's a Public School), organise free breakfast mornings for students and/or students, or set up a room which provides toiletries, warm clothing, food packages or stationery items for children in need or that have little 'accidents' at school.

vi) Family Songs night - If your family loves music, decide as a family a night in the week when you can gather together just to sing songs or play instruments. During these nights after singing familiar songs, you can choose to learn a new song. These songs can be used during your times when you visit neighbours, grandparents, or local services described in previous family traditions suggestions.

- vii) Prayer walk your community
 afternoon Once a week, as a
 family, you could walk around parts
 of your community for an hour
 offering prayers for your homes,
 families, service providers and
 local businesses. Here is a simple
 acronym you can use as your pray
 (with eyes open) as your walk.
- **B** = **Body**, their physical health and prevention from physical illness
- L = Labour, regular employment, enough income to meet their needs and to share
- **E = Emotional healing**, joy and inner peace
- **S = Spiritual**, relationship with Jesus and protection from evil forces.
- **S** = **Social**, loving relationships in their home and with the community.

They can also use their memory verses from this workbook or previous lessons to claim or pray blessings over families as they walk around the neighbourhood.

Family Worship questions you can discuss about this topic includes:

- a) Why do you think God invented families?
- b) What words do you think family members would use to describe you?

- c) How about if we were made to be by ourselves like many reptile who are not usually into family. What would we lose by not being part of a family?
- d) Which family member tests your patience the most?
- e) How can you show God's love to the family member that annoys you the most?
- f) How can you make your family a better place to be apart of?

Memorise a memory verse about families text using the "Verse Towers" method outlined below (Instructions can be loaded onto the App):

Verse Towers explanation

Supplies

- ➤ A selection of similar sized boxes, such as shoe boxes.
- Wrapping paper, newsprints, or brown paper for wrapping the boxes.
- Index cards and markers or a computer, printer, and paper for printing out the words and reference of the memory verse.
- ➤ A copy of the memory verse for each team of players.

Instructions

- Wrap each box firmly in paper.
- Attach one word of the memory verse to one of the long sides of each box.
- Make a set of boxes for each team and give each team the oxes in a disorganized heap.

Other ideas

- Give an extra box to each group that contains some small gifts with Bible verses on them, such as balloons, stickers, erasers, etc. Or hide the gifts in one of the word boxes.
- Turn some of the boxes around so some of the words are hidden, and see if the children can remember the hidden words. Play this missing word game after the tower has been made and the children have read the verse. Continue to turn the boxes around until all the words are hidden and the children can say the verse without any prompts.
- ➤ Use several different verses and give each group a set of boxes, half of which are their own and half that belongs to another group. The players then have to swap words with the other teams until they get the ones they need. Then they can build their towers.

➤ Recycle the boxes to use with different verse. Cover them with clear adhesive film for increased durability and attach the words with removable adhesive putty



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
