HEY KIDS!

Before you start this booklet, ask your parent or guardian to read to you the episode questions on page 11 and go through the Discovery Bible Reading activity. This will give you the information and clues you need to finish the puzzles and activities.

Episode summary

• In this episode, Salome and Jono really want a Brik Blox set, which costs \$400! They ask Marica for the money, but she suggests they raise the funds themselves by selling banana bread. While Salome bakes, Jono makes a bread costume to attract a crowd. Soon, Emma and Emily open up a yogurt stall across the road and start stealing customers! The groups start fighting... but then they decide to join forces. Salome and Jono trade their Brik Blox set for honey, and then sell their banana bread with honey and yogurt. Yum!

Bible lesson

• Just like Salome, Emma and Emily have skills for cooking different things, God created all of us with different talents, personalities and desires that we can use to serve Him. Rather than fighting or getting jealous of one another, the Bible says that we should seek unity and work together. When we do, we can achieve far more than when we work alone!




DID YOU KNOW?

COOKING TIME

Ask your parent or guardian if you can make this recipe together! Head to your local supermarket to buy all the ingredients, then make it to enjoy or give away.

Salome's Banana Bread

Ingredients:

- 2 large or 3 medium very ripe bananas, peeled and mashed
- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/3 cup melted butter, unsalted or salted (whatever you prefer)
- 3/4 cup raw sugar (1/2 cup if you want it less sweet)
- 1 large egg, beaten
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda (not baking powder)
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- Pinch of salt

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 175C and butter an 8 x 4 inch loaf pan
- Mash the bananas and add in the melted butter, stir until smooth
- Mix in the sugar, egg and vanilla extract
- 4. To the wet mixture, add the flour, baking soda and salt
- 5. Pour the batter into your prepared loaf pan
- Bake for 55-65 minutes or until a toothpic or skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Crumbs are okay, wet batter is not.
- Allow the bread to cool, then remove from the pan and serve.


Notes:

There is no need for an electric mixer. A fork or whisk will do just fine.

The best bananas are ones that are over-ripe. The peel should be at least half brown and the inside should be squishy and browning.



FAMILY WORSHIP IDEA

Drawing morph!

What you'll need:

- A piece of paper and pen per person
- Sticky tape

Step 1: Give everyone a piece of paper and pen, then line them up.

Step 2: The person at the front of the line attaches their paper to the wall, while

the others tape their paper to the back of the person in front

Step 3: The person at the back of the line draws a picture, one line at a time, on the paper in front. The person in front must draw each line they feel, and so on.

Step 4: When the drawing is finished, compare the front and back drawings! Share about the importance of communication in creating unity and working together, and how not communicating creates problems.
